Laos Economic Integration

- ☐ Lao joined ASEAN in 1997
- □ Lao World Trade Organisation member 2012
- ☐ Supports economic liberalisation & principles of good governance enhancing stability and economic integration


Narrowing the Development Gap for Economic Integration

- □ ASEAN Summit 2000 launched Initiative for ASEAN Integration (IAI)
- ☐ Hanoi Declaration on Narrowing the Development Gap (NDG) in 2001
- □ Realisation of ASEAN Community by 2015 makes Narrowing Development Gap (NDG) more urgent

Narrowing the Development Gap for Economic Integration

- □ IAI must be supplemented by national efforts to achieve economic integration in ASEAN
- □ Continued growth in GDP requires greater domestic economic activities & new sources of Capital

Sources of Development Capital - Laos



Public Administration Reform (PAR) for Private Sector

- □ Nature of government & PAR evolves with development of Economy
- ☐ Govt. becomes Provider of policy, national institutions and legal frameworks, to promote private sector growth
- ☐ Emergence of Public Private Partnerships

PAR Challenges of Private Sector

- □ New institutions & processes & new skills for public sector;
 - Partnership management
 - Negotiation,
 - Contract management
 - Greater oversight responsibility

Private Sector Good Governance

- □ Core Principles of Governance apply to Public and Private sectors:
 - Participation involvement of stakeholders
 - Transparency openness of decision making
 - Accountability responsibility to Society
 - Rule of Law- rules apply fairly to everyone
 - Efficiency- without waste or corruption

Laos perspectives on PAR in ASEAN

- ☐ Greater shared responsibilities means new administrative mechanisms to support greater need for:
 - Accountability
 - Predictability
 - Transparency
 - Rule of law trade rules

Laos perspectives on PAR in ASEAN

- ☐ Some mechanisms/initiatives ;-
 - Milestones for integration that Identify related Public Sector reforms needed
 - Regional approach to human resources development and capacity development
 - Networks of Public Servants for key functions
 - Networks for core private Sector actors
